AEDC helped launch "Buy Alaska," encouraging Alaskans to purchase goods and services produced by Alaska businesses that primarily hire Alaskans. In 1993 the Buy Alaska committee reports \$5.5 million for in-state purchase agreements, exceeding goals by \$2.2 million.

AIR PASSENGER SERVICE INCENTIVE

AEDC and Korean Air announce a deal to bring four weekly flights from Seoul to Anchorage. The service adds roughly \$77 million into the Anchorage economy and creates around 600 jobs.

Buy Alaska program funnels over \$15 million into the Alaska economy and creates more than 330 jobs. 4,397 businesses participate in the Buy Alaska program at this time.

NEW BUSINESS INCENTIVE PROGRAM

Senate Bill 159 is approved by the Alaska State Legislature. The new law includes funding for the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority (AIDEA), \$3 million in grant appropriations to support export manufacturing, workforce training and business development costs.









SINGLE FAMILY HOUSING UNIT SALES: AVERAGE PRICE

ANCHORAGE EMPLOYMENT








TRANSPORTATION CARGO STATS: 2012 SHORT TONS
