
September 2012 Employment Report

Executive Summary

The year to date (YTD) non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Anchorage is down 0.1% from August, averaging 5.8%. This is 0.5% lower than the 2011 YTD average. The monthly rate has gone down 0.3% from August, and 0.7% from August 2011. The monthly unemployment rate has dropped 0.6% since the beginning of the year. The increase of 546 in the employment total during the YTD period is primarily attributed to a reduction of 833 in the unemployment total, but also encompasses a 287 person decrease in the Anchorage labor force.

It is important to note that these unemployment numbers represent the labor force residing in Anchorage, and do not include jobs in Anchorage held by residents from outside the municipality. The industry employment estimates referenced in the remainder of this report are representative of all jobs in the Municipality of Anchorage, regardless of the job holder's place of residency.


As for the Anchorage Industry Employment estimates, the YTD average has maintained its upwards momentum and has a total increase of 1,589 over 2011 YTD. Industries showing the most improved YTD growth rates from August to September include educational & health services and professional & business services. Seven of the ten major sector's September 2012 averages are above September 2011's, indicating sustained growth in many fields.



Overall, unemployment is averaging **5.8%** in Anchorage for the first 9 months of 2012, which is **0.5%** below 2011 for the same time.

Services Producing Jobs


Services producing jobs in Anchorage (engineering, retail, tourism, healthcare, etc.) totaled 144,700 for September, the second highest monthly total in the last ten years (June 2012 was #1 at 154,800). The educational and health services sector's growth rate continues to improve with a 2.86% YTD growth (+667 jobs). YTD job averages for many other service industries are also staying positive, including transportation (+267), professional & business services (+433) and food services (+311). Though the YTD percentage change dropped 0.06% in September to 0.93%, the services sector may still achieve a 1% gain by the end of the year.



Health Care Employment


In January, AEDC predicted a growth for 2012 of 700 health care jobs. So far this year, the health care industry is averaging 478 more jobs than 2011's YTD, for a 2.79% increase. This is below the 4.02% rate of growth needed to reach the AEDC's predicted mark by the end of the year, but higher than the national average of 1.9% growth. Current employment trends indicate a continuation of this rate of growth, with 2012's annual average ending up approximately 500 jobs from 2011.






Goods Producing Jobs

Goods producing jobs, which are construction work, mining and oil & gas production (those jobs that are specifically tied to production, not those which support the production or maintenance of the production jobs) are still growing, averaging 289 more jobs in 2012 YTD over the same period in 2011. Total construction jobs in September 2012 are higher than September 2011's count by 200. If the sector averages 8,100 total jobs per month for the next three months, the construction sector will see little to no change in the annual average from 2011. The oil & gas and manufacturing sectors are continuing to show strong positive growth with YTD increases of 3.97% and 10.29%, respectively.






Professional & Business Services

Jobs in this sector include those in engineering, architecture, legal services, accounting, scientific research, waste management and administrative services industries. The YTD average is up 433 jobs from 2011 and the sector's growth rate has increased nearly a quarter percentage point since August. Job creation in this sector is more than twice the AEDC's January prediction of a gain of 150 jobs and shows no signs of contraction.

Transportation

September's preliminary estimate (11,900) continues to illustrate this industry's strong year. The 267 increase in 2012 vs. 2011 YTD is well above the AEDC predicted growth of 100 jobs. Preliminary figures from the Alaska Travel Industry Association show an increase in summer visitors this year, which may be a factor in this growth. Also, an optimistic holiday forecast from Federal Express may be a sign that the sector's upcoming fall employment levels will follow historical trends and finish the year at or above projected growth.



Transportation Jobs in September 2012






Unemployment rate at 7.5 percent in September

Alaska's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate fell two-tenths of a percentage point in September to 7.5 percent. August's rate was revised down one-tenth of a percentage point to 7.7 percent.


September's decline ended a four-month stretch of rate increases. Rates so far in 2012 — which will be revised at the end of the year when more information is available — do not show a clear trend up or down.

The national seasonally adjusted rate was 7.8 percent in September, down from August's 8.1 percent. The U.S. rate remains about a percentage point above its 10-year average, while Alaska's is near its 10-year average.

Seasonally adjusting Alaska's unemployment rate allows it to be compared to the national rate. Seasonal adjustment attempts to smooth out typical seasonal changes in the numbers so nonseasonal trends in the economy can be identified.

Alaska's not-seasonally adjusted rate was 6.4 percent in September, down slightly from August's revised rate of 6.5 percent. September 2011's not-seasonally adjusted rate was 6.9 percent.

Across the state, the not-seasonally adjusted rates fell over the year in five of six regions. The largest decline was in the Anchorage/Mat-Su region, where the rate declined from 6.3 percent in September 2011 to 5.7 percent for September 2012. September's rate was also down from last year in the Northern, Southeast, Gulf Coast and

Interior regions. In Southwest Alaska, the only region with an over-the-year increase, the rate rose from 11.8 percent in September 2011 to 12.8 percent in September 2012.
