This report summarizes the most recently updated data contained in the Anchorage Economic Indicators Database. With this database, AEDC continually tracks and updates more than 25 different measures of economic activity in the Anchorage area.

#### **Quarterly Employment**


- Total employment in Anchorage decreased by 360 jobs between the second quarter of 2008 and the second quarter of 2009, a decrease of 0.2 percent. On average, 153,270 workers were employed during the second quarter of 2009, based on Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development data.
- The largest increases in employment between the second quarter of 2008 and the second quarter of 2009 occurred in the health care sector (630 new jobs) and the government sector (430 new jobs).
- The largest declines in employment between the second quarter of 2008 and the second quarter of 2009 occurred in the construction sector (530 fewer jobs) and the transportation/warehouse/utilities sector (300 fewer jobs).

#### **Building Permit Values**

- Total building permit values, including residential, commercial and government construction, decreased from \$158.9 million in the second quarter of 2008 to \$130.0 million in the second quarter of 2009, a decrease of approximately 18.2 percent.
- Commercial building permit values decreased by 34.8 percent, from \$99.5 million to \$64.8 million.
- Residential building permit values decreased by 5.3 percent, from \$43.2 million to \$40.9 million.
- Government construction permit values increased by 49.7 percent, from \$16.2 million to \$24.3 million.




- Total passenger deplanements declined by 8.8 percent between the second quarter of 2008 and the second quarter of 2009.
- The number of passenger aircraft landings dropped by 11.8 percent over the same period.
- The amount of transit cargo passing through Anchorage International Airport decreased by 41.1 percent over the same period.




Anchorage Unemployment, 2nd Quarter, 2004-2009





#### **Average Monthly Earnings and Total Payroll**

- Average monthly earnings in Anchorage increased from \$3,864 in 2007 to \$4,011 in 2008, an increase of 3.8 percent.
- Total payroll increased by 5.3 percent over the same period of 2007 to \$333,819 in the third quarter of 2008, an increase of 2 percent.



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
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
#### **Single Family Housing Unit Sales**

- The average sales price of a single family house in Anchorage decreased from \$329,842 in the second quarter of 2008 to \$322,851 in the second quarter of 2009, a decrease of 2.1 percent.
- The number of single-family housing units sold increased by 13.8 percent between the second quarter of 2008 and the second quarter of 2009.




#### Port of Anchorage Annual Tonnage

• Port of Anchorage annual tonnage for 2008 totaled 4.4 million short tons, an increase of 1.0 percent since 2007.




#### **Room Rentals**

- Gross revenue from room rentals, an indicator for lodging activity in Anchorage, decreased by 21.6 percent between the second quarter of 2008 and the second quarter of 2009.
- Taxable revenue from room rentals decreased by 23.5 percent between the second quarter of 2008 and the second quarter of 2009.



#### **Car and RV Rentals**


- Revenue from car and RV rentals, a gauge for visitor activity, decreased by 25.9 percent between the second quarter of 2008 and the second quarter of 2009.
- Tax revenue from car and RV rentals decreased by 26.4 percent over the same period.



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#### **Consumer Price Index**

- The Anchorage Consumer Price Index increased from 187.7 in the first half of 2008 to 190.0 in the first half of 2009, an increase of 1.2 percent.
- The U.S. Consumer Price Index decreased by 0.6 percent, from 214.4 to 213.1 over the same time period.



#### **Population**

• The population of Anchorage increased from 282,375 in 2007 to 284,994 in 2008, an increase of 0.9 percent.

#### **Unemployment Rate**

• The Anchorage unemployment rate increased from 5.6 percent in the second quarter of 2008 to 6.9 percent in the second quarter of 2009, an increase of 1.3 percentage points.
