
Fourth Edition

This report summarizes the most recently updated data contained in the Anchorage Economic Indicators Database. With this database, AEDC continually tracks and updates more than 25 different measures of economic activity in the Anchorage area.



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
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
Quarterly Employment

- According to the Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development (ADOLWD) Current Employment Statistics, total employment in Anchorage decreased by approximately 1,500 jobs between the fourth quarter of 2008 and the fourth quarter of 2009, a decrease of 1.0 percent. On average, 150,400 workers were employed during the fourth quarter of 2009. Average employment for the year declined by 900 jobs (a decline of 0.6 percent), according to the same source.
- The largest declines in employment between the fourth quarter of 2008 and the fourth quarter of 2009 occurred in the construction sector (900 lost jobs) transportation/trade/utilities sector (700 lost jobs), and the information sector (400 lost jobs).
- The largest increases in employment between the fourth quarter of 2008 and the fourth quarter of 2009 occurred in the health sector (870 new jobs), local government education sector (330 new jobs), and state government sector (270 new jobs).



Building Permit Values


- Total building permit values, including residential, commercial and government construction, increased from \$54.9 million in the fourth quarter of 2008 to \$57.1 million in the fourth quarter of 2009, an increase of approximately 3.9 percent.
- Commercial building permit values increased by 11.5 percent, from \$30.5 million to \$34.1 million.
- Residential building permit values increased by 9.2 percent, from \$15.2 million to \$16.6 million.
- Government construction permit values decreased by 30.5 percent, from \$9.1 million to \$6.4 million.




Ted Stevens Anchorage International Airport Statistics

Total passenger deplanements declined by 3.3 percent between the fourth quarter of 2008 and the fourth quarter of 2009.


- The number of passenger aircraft landings dropped by 4.5 percent over the same period.
- The amount of transit cargo passing through Anchorage International Airport increased by 27.4 percent over the same period.







Port of Anchorage Annual Tonnage

• Port of Anchorage annual tonnage for 2009 totaled 3.8 million short tons, a decrease of 12.9 percent since 2008.







Single Family Housing Unit Sales


- The average sales price of a single-family house in Anchorage increased from \$312,420 in the fourth quarter of 2008 to \$316,732 in the fourth quarter of 2009, an increase of 1.4 percent.
- The number of single-family housing units sold increased by 23.8 percent between the fourth quarter of 2008 and the fourth quarter of 2009.


Room Rentals

- Gross revenue from room rentals, an indicator for lodging activity in Anchorage, decreased by 6.3 percent between the fourth quarter of 2008 and the fourth quarter of 2009.
- Taxable revenue from room rentals decreased by 9.8 percent between the fourth quarter of 2008 and the fourth quarter of 2009.

Car and RV Rentals

- Revenue from car and RV rentals, a gauge for visitor activity, declined by 2.2 percent between the fourth quarter of 2008 and the fourth quarter of 2009.
- Tax revenue from car and RV rentals decreased by 5.1 percent over the same period






Consumer Price Index

- The Anchorage Consumer Price Index increased from 189.5 in 2008 to 191.7 in 2009, an increase of 1.2 percent.
- The U.S. Consumer Price Index decreased by 0.3 percent, from 215.3 to 214.6 over the same time period.


Population

• The population of Anchorage increased from 283,912 in 2008 to 290,588 in 2009, an increase of 2.4 percent.



Unemployment Rate

• The Anchorage unemployment rate increased from 5.6 percent in the fourth quarter of 2008 to 6.8 percent in the fourth quarter of 2009, an increase of 1.2 percentage points.
