

# Total Jobs = Goods + Services






# **Executive Summary**

The year to date (YTD) non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Anchorage is averaging 5.9%. While the monthly rate is up 0.7% from May, it is down 0.6% from the same point in 2011. Similar spikes of 0.2-0.7% have occurred between May and June over the last three years and are common most years. The monthly unemployment rate in Anchorage has risen 0.5% since the beginning of the year. The increase of 775 in the unemployment total during this period is primarily attributed to a reduction of 404 in the employment total, but also encompasses a 371 person increase in the Anchorage labor force.

It is important to note that these employment numbers represent the labor force residing in Anchorage, and do not include jobs in Anchorage held by residents from outside the municipality. The industry employment estimates referenced in the remainder of this report are representative of all people employed in the Municipality of Anchorage, regardless of residency.


As for the Anchorage Industry Employment estimates, the YTD average has maintained its upwards momentum and has added 77 total jobs since May's report, for a total increase of 1,517 over 2011 YTD. Significant growth rate increases were seen in the construction industry and in the goods producing sector in general. Seven of the ten major sector's June 2012 averages are above June 2011's, indicating sustained growth in many fields.




Overall, unemployment is averaging **5.9%** in Anchorage for the first 6 months of 2012, which is **0.6%** below 2011 for the same time.

#### Services Producing Jobs


Services producing jobs in Anchorage (engineering, retail, tourism, healthcare, etc.) totaled a robust 160,400 for June. This marked the largest month to month increase for the year (3,500) and is just over 1% from the June YTD average of 2011. As expected, the healthcare industry continues to lead the growth with a 3.13% YTD growth (533 jobs). YTD job averages for many other service industries are still showing growth, including transportation (333), professional & business services (300) and food services (233). The absolute total of service jobs has peaked in June for the last II years and is expected to follow suit this year. If this year's fall retraction maintains a similar rate to 2011, the service industry should hang on to its 1% gain.





#### Goods Producing Jobs


Goods producing jobs, which are construction work, mining and oil & gas production (those jobs that are specifically tied to production, not those which support the production or maintenance of the production jobs) made significant gains, averaging 150 more jobs in 2012 YTD over 2011's. After lagging in month to month comparisons, total construction jobs in June 2012 have matched the June 2011 level of 9,100. Along with an increase in May's estimate (due to a revision), the strong June numbers in the construction industry were the main source of the 2012 YTD average increase.



### Health Care Employment


In January, AEDC predicted a growth for 2012 of 700 health care jobs. So far this year, the health care industry is averaging 533 more jobs than 2011's YTD. This is an increase of 3.13%. The rate of growth in health care will need to reach 4.07% by the end of the year to hit AEDC's predicted mark.






#### Professional & Business Services

Jobs in this sector include those in legal services, accounting, scientific research, waste management and administrative services industries. While the YTD average is up 300 jobs from 2011, this year's rate of growth is just over half of last years, indicating a slowdown in job creation. However, this trend is not occurring as rapidly as early models suggested, and job creation in this industry is currently twice the AEDC's January prediction of a gain of 150 jobs. Increased activity in the oil and gas industry may be boosting employment in this group as well.







#### Transportation

June's preliminary estimate (12,200) is the first month's estimate to top the 2011 highwater mark of 12,100 in this industry. The 333 increase in 2012 vs. 2011 YTD is well above the AEDC predicted growth of 100 jobs. Improving conditions in the visitor industry should help maintain these gains through the summer.

# Unemployment rate at 7.3 percent in June

Alaska's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 7.3 percent for June, up from May's rate of 7.0 percent. The U.S. rate remained at 8.2 percent. The state and national jobless rates have both changed very little during the first half of 2012 — Alaska's rate has ranged from 6.9 to 7.3 percent, and the nation's has been between 8.1 and 8.3 percent.

It is too early to tell whether the June increase in Alaska's rate indicates a new trend. Both the Alaska and U.S. rates remain below year-ago levels. Alaska's rate is down half a percentage point and the national rate is eight-tenths of a percentage point lower than in June 2011.


Alaska's rate is hovering at its 10-year average, and the state's job count has increased each year after a small decline in 2009. In contrast, the nation is still recovering its recession-related job losses and the national unemployment rate remains well above pre-recession levels.

In May, 28 states had higher rates than Alaska and 21 had lower rates. The highest was in Nevada at 11.6 percent, and the lowest was 3.0 percent in North Dakota.

Regional employment rates, which are not seasonally adjusted, ranged from 2.2 percent in Bristol Bay to 25.6 percent in Wade Hampton.
