EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

MONTHLY UNEMPLOYMENT

The non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Anchorage in February was 5.6 percent, up 0.4 percent from January's revised rate. This is below the national rate of 5.8 percent and the statewide rate of 7.6 percent. The January unemployment rate for Anchorage was 0.3 percent lower than it was at the same time in 2014 and February was 0.1 percent lower. While it's still very early in the year, this is a very positive sign for the city's residents. *As always, it should be noted that these are preliminary survey figures for February and will be revised next month.*

YEAR-TO-DATE UNEMPLOYMENT

The average year-to-date (YTD) non-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Anchorage was 5.4 percent at the end of February, 0.2 percent lower than at this time last year. **An increase of 1,493 in the employment total and 1,201 in the Anchorage labor force during the YTD period has resulted in the reported unemployment total decreasing by 292. This increase in the YTD Anchorage labor pool is the largest for this period since 2003.** The total number of unemployed people in Anchorage for the month of February is estimated at 8,891 (those actively looking for jobs), 169 less than February 2014. In the Mat-Su Borough, the YTD average monthly unemployment rate is down 0.3 percent from 2014 YTD while the Kenai Peninsula's has decreased by 0.2 percent during the same period (see the charts at the end of this report for more details).

It is important to note that these Anchorage unemployment numbers represent the labor force residing in Anchorage, and does not describe the number of filled positions in Anchorage. The industry employment estimates referenced in the remainder of this report are representative of the number of jobs in the Municipality of Anchorage, regardless of the job holder's place of residency.

ANCHORAGE INDUSTRY EMPLOYMENT ESTIMATES

As for Anchorage industry employment estimates, which includes total jobs in Anchorage held by city residents and commuters, **the YTD average for 2015 shows a decrease of 150 jobs so far from 2014 YTD.**

The private sector (total jobs minus government jobs) has shrunk by 50 jobs during this time, while Government employment has increased by 200. Federal jobs have declined by 100 so far, but State and Local Government jobs have increased by 50 and 200, respectively. While the overall reductions are concerning, it's important to note that it is early in the year and these figures will likely be revised as more data is received and additional analysis is conducted.

In the Goods Producing category, the Mining & Logging industry (which includes Oil & Gas employment) has continued last year's impressive growth trends and is showing the largest YTD growth. Service Providing industries such as Information and Trade/Transportation/Utilities (TTU) are also showing strong growth. Four of the ten major industries' February 2015 averages (Mining & Logging, TTU, Information and Government) are at or above February 2014 totals.


February Unemployment Rate for Anchorage

MONTHLY REVISIONS

Each month, the Alaska Department of Labor's Research and Analysis Division revises the previous month employment numbers based on the availability of newer or late arriving data. The following tables show the revision changes in Anchorage's and Alaska's January job totals by industry.

Most adjustments are relatively minor, however, some changes do occur, which are significant. Changes such as these are normally the result of rounding errors, job classification modifications, sample size or modeling issues, or errors within the industry




CONSTRUCTION WORK, MINING, OIL & GAS PRODUCTION, MANUFACTURING

Growth in the number of Goods Producing jobs (*those jobs that are specifically tied to production, not those which support the production or maintenance of the production jobs*) is showing no change for 2015 YTD. February's total of 12,600 is 100 jobs less than February 2014. An increase of 50 jobs in the Mining & Logging industry (which includes oil & gas employment) is the group's only gaining industry, while YTD Construction employment is flat and Manufacturing is down 50.

Following four years of positive movement, the Oil & Gas sector YTD job total shows no change this year compared to 2014 YTD. Exploration efforts by most North Slope oil field developers has proceeded as scheduled and companies are cautiously moving forward with business as usual.

The Construction industry is showing no YTD job growth or losses over the 2014 YTD total. Both January and February monthly estimates of 7,000 jobs are the same as the periods for 2014. Construction employment typically stays flat for the first two to three months of the year and begins growing in April, culminating in employment totals near 10,000 in August.

Anchorage building permit values, a measure of interest in construction, have reached \$66.6 million through February. This is well below the \$112 million at this point last year. Some construction companies are indicating that due to a lack of large projects, they are now bidding on smaller jobs they would have passed on in previous years to maintain workloads. How high the level of summer employment in construction will reach will become clearer in April or May and is an important figure to watch.



SERVICES PROVIDING JOBS


ENGINEERING, RETAIL, TOURISM, HEALTH CARE, ETC.

Services Providing jobs in Anchorage totaled 140,600 for February.

Overall, the YTD average is down 200 jobs from 2014 YTD.

The Trade/Transportation/Utilities (TTU) industry's growth rate is 1.4 percent so far this year and is the highest growth area in the service sector. The YTD employment average in this industry is up 450 jobs already this year. The Retail Trade sector, a subset of the TTU industry, is continuing its strong growth trend in 2015, adding 650 positions YTD compared to 2014 YTD, by far the largest numerical growth of any sector.

The Government jobs monthly average is up 200 jobs YTD from 2014 due to YTD growth of 200 in Local Education positions. The Federal Government sector is averaging 100 fewer jobs than at this point last year, while State Government positions have increased by 50. State Education jobs, a subset of State Government, have decreased by 50 YTD.




HEALTH CARE EMPLOYMENT

Employment in the Health Care sector is still doing well, with **250 more jobs over 2014 YTD**. Every year since 2003, this sector has seen year-over-year growth. The 1.36 percent YTD job growth seen in 2015 indicates another growth year for health care. Health care providers in Anchorage are indicating that the hospitals are continuing to recruit staff with specialized skills, but the bulk of hiring in recent months has been in primary care or private offices. As noted in AEDC's 2015 Economic Forecast report, **we expect this sector to be one of the bright points in an uncertain year for job growth.**

TRANSPORTATION

Monthly estimates in the Transportation/Warehouse/Utilities sector (a sub-group of the Trade/Transportation/Utilities industry) are continuing to lag behind trends of the last four years. **The February YTD total is 450 jobs less than 2014 and is the lowest February total since 2010.**

The Bureau of Labor Statistics Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) data for 2014 through the third quarter shows a significant drop in truck transportation jobs, trending between 467 to 566 less each month. However, water transportation and scenic and sightseeing positions had excellent growth in the second half of the 2014, with monthly estimates from May to September gaining between 624 to 724 over the previous year. With sizable growth in the retail economy and a strong tourist season on the horizon, this segment of the Trade/Transportation/Utilities industry may help bolster the overall job total.


PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS SERVICES

ENGINEERING, ARCHITECTURE, LEGAL SERVICES, ACCOUNTING, SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH, WASTE MANAGEMENT & ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

After reaching 21,400 in August of 2014, employment in professional and business services has dropped steadily and is now at 19,500 in February, with the YTD average down 450 jobs from 2014. The 2014 QCEW data through the third quarter shows the majority of these losses came from two areas, the professional, scientific and technical field and the management of companies and enterprises field. The slowdown shown in the construction numbers and few indications of new oil field developments on the horizon give some insight to the cause of this industry's decreases. Firms may have been cutting back staff as older projects were completed without newer contracts being signed.

TRANSPORTATION EMPLOYMENT


Municipality of Anchorage 2011-Present





UNEMPLOYMENT CLAIMS

Initial unemployment claim applications can be interpreted as a proxy for layoffs. They tend to fall as job growth accelerates. Weekly totals for 2014 were below 2013 for all but one week, and so far, 2015 weekly totals have been below 2014 every week. As reported in the Department of Labor's press release (found at the end of this report), the implementation of new work search requirements for claimants has contributed in part to this decline. Job retention also seems to be holding steady throughout the state, which is also being reflected in the ongoing drop in the state's YTD unemployment rate.



Continuing claims figures help to show how well unemployed workers are re-entering the workforce. This total does not include workers receiving extended benefits from the federal government. The 2014 numbers, similar to the initial claims figures, showed significantly lower levels than 2013. Weekly totals have been between 3,100 to 4,900 claimants lower since October and are continuing on a steady decline. Again, the new work search requirements may be causing some workers to leave the system, but the strong growth in employment throughout the state (up 4,100 jobs YTD compared to 2014) indicates a high level of opportunity for workers.









Unemployment rate at 6.3 percent in February

Alaska's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 6.3 percent in February, unchanged from January. The national rate was 5.5 percent.

Alaska's seasonally adjusted rate fell substantially during the second half of 2014 after a long period of relative stability. One factor in the decline was fewer unemployment insurance claimants after the fall implementation of new work search requirements.

Alaska's not-seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 7.6 percent in February, up half a percentage point from January. The unadjusted rate usually peaks in January or February before starting its normal seasonal decline into summer.

The Aleutians West Census Area and the Aleutians East and Kodiak Island boroughs had the lowest unadjusted rates in February at 2.6, 3.4 and 5.3 percent, respectively. These coastal areas buck Alaska's normal seasonal trend because their ports and processing facilities support the Bering Sea and Gulf of Alaska winter groundfish fisheries, which are the state's largest by both volume and dollar value.

Rates in the Wade Hampton and Yukon Koyukuk census areas were among the highest in the state. Both areas consistently have some of the state's highest rates year-round. Jobless rates were also high in areas with a single dominant seasonal economy, such as the Denali and Bristol Bay boroughs and the Municipality of Skagway.
