WHY DO YOU LIVE IN ANCHORAGE?





INTRODUCTION

The Anchorage Economic Development Corporation (AEDC) has a bold vision: to make Anchorage the #1 city in America. AEDC strives for this goal through a grassroots movement called Live. Work. Play. (LWP). The rationale for such a vision goes beyond the traditional economic development model and responds to a shift in paradigm - people are no longer going where the jobs are; instead people are going to places they want to live and jobs are going where they are. LWP works to foster the city's economic development by supporting community re-development efforts through strategic partnerships, a focused approach toward identifying and addressing the issues and a rigorous data-driven evaluation of the progress.

The LWP vision was adopted by the AEDC Board of Directors in 2010. To set the target and measure progress toward achieving it, an aspirational grassroots narrative was developed with a set of 30-plus quantitative metrics to measure each element of Live, Work and Play. The narrative was formed in 2010 after surveying the community with two questions: Why do you live in Anchorage? Why would you leave Anchorage? This original survey resulted in 750 responses.

LWP has grown from 35 supporters in 2010 to more than 200 in 2015, working on over 40 different projects with a shared objective. In 2015, AEDC announced the re-launch of our Live. Work. Play. initiative survey in an effort to get a new pulse on Anchorage and check that our narrative is still on point. The survey was composed of two main questions: Why do you live in Anchorage? Why would you leave Anchorage?

The survey closed August 31, 2015, with more than 1,250 responses. The LWP Narrative Review Committee, made up of over 30 community members from a diverse array of backgrounds, was convened to review all the submissions and make any needed revisions to the Narrative, the results of which are presented here.

Anchorage's narrative for Live. Work. Play. gives a detailed aspirational look at what it will be when it is the #1 city to live, work and play in 2025.



LIVE.

EMPLOYMENT

Anchorage is a thriving community and business hub for most of the state of Alaska. It boasts the ability to weather economic recessions and its residents account for nearly half of the total statewide population.

Anchorage provides a diversified spectrum of employment with a wide range of benefits, workplace amenities and opportunities for career growth.

EDUCATION

Residents of Anchorage have wide access to job training resources, including access to the Alaska Job Center Network. This network offers a variety of job training services to help Alaskans qualify to obtain high-demand jobs that lead to economic self-sufficiency. A wide variety of services are available to help individuals determine the job or career that is right for them. Services include workshops, networking, labor market information, resource rooms, career counseling, aptitude/skill/interest assessments, apprenticeships, on-the-job training, educational and job training services, case management support and other support services to help participants while in training.

In 2025, Anchorage's youngest have safe, stimulating, culturally relevant early-learning opportunities, and every child starting school is ready to learn and succeed. Children are proficient readers by 4th grade. The community actively supports youth to stay on track and make positive choices for today and the future. Youth graduate on time and are ready to begin careers and/or complete post-secondary education.

The options are many, including a statewide university system, private colleges and vocational training opportunities that attract students from near and far, adding to the diverse population already thriving in Anchorage.

DIVERSITY

The mosaic of ethnicities, cultures, gender identities, sexual orientations, ages, religions and abilities are interwoven into education, resources, jobs, adventure and discovery. Local government, educational institutions and civic and business leaders are active participants in fostering an inclusive community. People feel safe, are engaged and stay in Anchorage. As a growing city, there is something for everyone.


COST OF LIVING

Anchorage is a place where the cost of living is supported by quality of life and opportunity for well-paying jobs. The cost of living is competitive with other parts of the country and Anchorage residents enjoy affordable services such as housing, health care, transportation, utilities and food. Opportunities for low or no-cost recreation, arts and cultural events and entertainment abound.

HEALTH & SAFETY

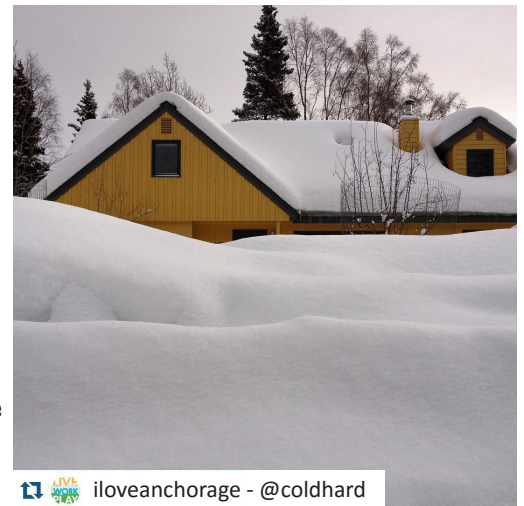

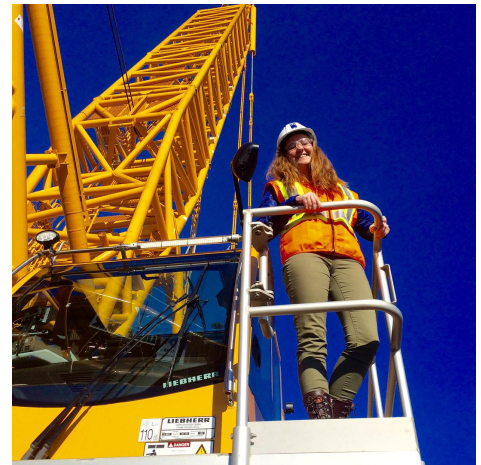
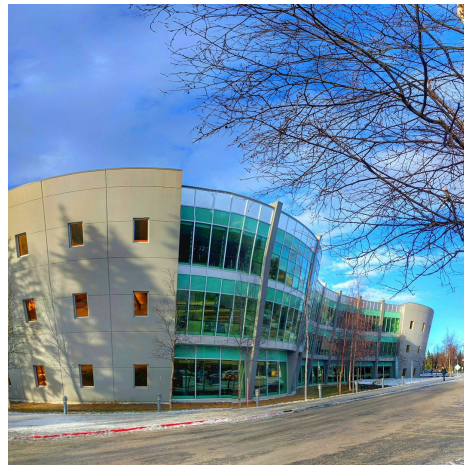

The Alaska economy has diversified from primarily oil and gas industries and government infrastructure jobs to include the retail sector, year-round tourism, transportation and shipping, medical and education sector jobs. 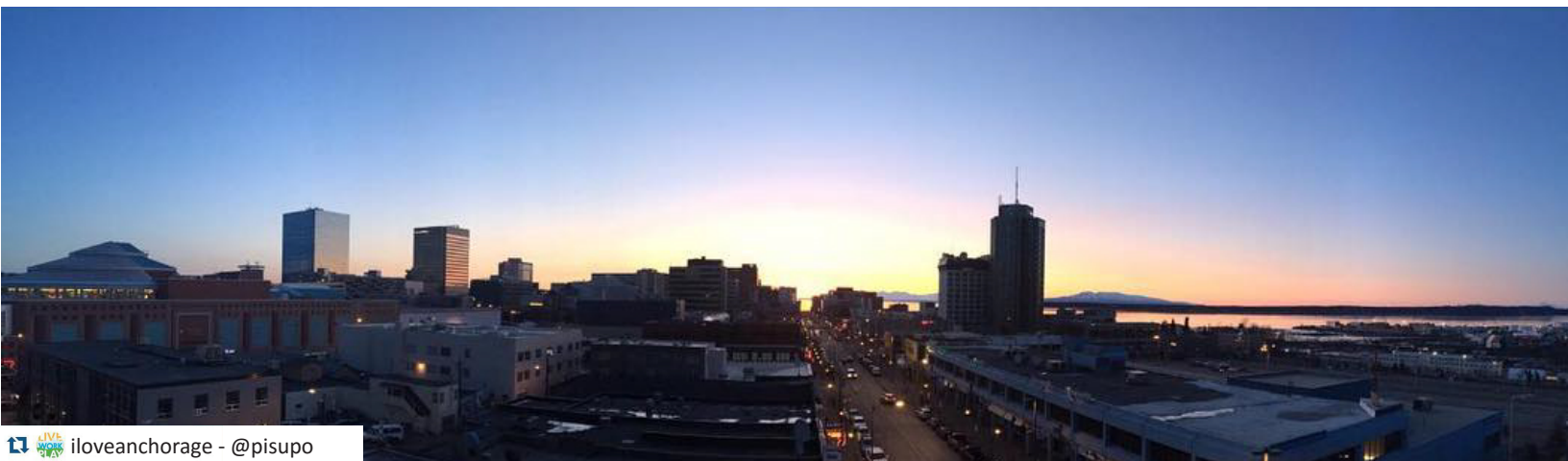

RECREATION
