MONTHLY SUMMARY

Job numbers for the month of September show an increase of 4,300 jobs up from September of 2020. Almost all sectors saw positive growth with the exception of oil & gas, manufacturing, information, healthcare, and federal government.

The number of single-family homes sold year-to-date has increased by 12%. The average sale price so far in 2021 has risen by 11%. Single-family home listings decreased by 62% compared to the same period in 2020, suggesting that the housing market is falling deeper into a seller's market. The top five companies posting jobs are Providence Health & Services, Humana, Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium, GCI Communications and Alaska Teacher Placement.



THE BOTTOM LINE

Anchorage's job market is rebounding after a devastating 2020. Almost every industry sector is seeing significant job growth compared to September 2020; however, economic trends indicate that we are 3 to 5 years away from full employment recovery to pre-pandemic levels.


ANCHORAGE EMPLOYMENT

Total Anchorage employment is at 143,400 in September of 2021, showing an increase of 4,300 jobs compared to the same month in 2020.

CONSTRUCTION EMPLOYMENT

At 8,400 jobs, Anchorage construction employment is up 200 jobs, a 2.4% increase in September compared to the same period in 2020.

OIL & GAS EMPLOYMENT

Anchorage's oil and gas sector shed 200 jobs between September 2021 and September 2020. This is a 10% decline.

SERVICES PROVIDING JOBS

Services providing industries gained approximately 4,300 jobs between September of 2021 and September of 2020. This significant job growth is mainly the result of the continuing vaccination efforts to suppress the COVID-19 pandemic and a return of opportunities in the tourism sector.


PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS SERVICES

Anchorage's professional & business services sector saw an increase of 300 jobs in September 2021 compared to the same month in 2020.


HEALTH CARE EMPLOYMENT

Health care employment is showing down 100 jobs in September 2021 versus September 2020. With hospital entering critical care levels due to the recent COVID-19 surge this could mean regular procedures and general staff have been reduced.


Services Providing Jobs Municipality of Anchorage 2016 - Present






ANCHORAGE SINGLE-FAMILY HOME LISTINGS

YTD 10-YEAR COMPARISON

Anchorage's single-family home listings stood at 474 for the month of September 2021, a decrease of 131 from 605 listings in September 2020, a -12% decline in inventory for sale from 2020.








Anchorage Single Family Home Average Sale Price

YTD 10-Year Comparison as of 09/30/2021




ANCHORAGE SINGLE-FAMILY HOME AVERAGE SALES PRICE

YTD 10-YEAR COMPARISON

The average price of a single-family home in Anchorage stood at \$425,428 in September 2021, up \$32,269 from \$393,159 in September 2020. Year to date, the average price of a home sold in Anchorage in 2021 stands at \$422,298, which is up \$32,296 compared to the same period in 2020 or an increase of 11%.

ANCHORAGE SINGLE-FAMILY HOMES TOTAL UNIT SALES

YTD 10-YEAR COMPARISON

The number of single-family home unit sales year-to-date increased in August 2021 to 2,647, up by 366 units sold compared to the period in 2020, showing a significant 12% increase in home sales for the year.

UNEMPLOMENT DATA

Anchorage's unemployment rate in September was 4.8%, down .6% compared to the previous month of September. This time last year, Anchorage had an unemployment rate of 6.4% in September of 2020. As we continue to see unemployment rates fluctuate, we want to keep in mind that changes are on the horizon with the State of Alaska moving on from federal unemployment aid. In September there were 7,093 unemployed individuals compared to 9,194 in September of 2020. Anchorage's labor force stands at 147,271 (employment + unemployment = labor force).


Anchorage continues to show the lowest unemployment numbers in the southcentral region with Kenai coming in at 5.9% unemployment, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough at 5.5% unemployment and the State of Alaska as a whole at 5.1% unemployment for the month of September 2021.
