MONTHLY SUMMARY

Job numbers for the month of October show an increase of 4,100 jobs up from October of 2020. Almost all sectors saw positive growth with the exception of oil & gas, manufacturing, information, healthcare, and federal government.

The number of single-family homes sold year-to-date has increased by 12%. The average sale price so far in 2021 has risen by 11%. Single-family home listings decreased by 62% compared to the same period in 2020, suggesting that the housing market is falling deeper into a seller's market. The top five companies posting jobs are Providence Health & Services, Humana, Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium, Anchorage Daily News, GCI Communications and Alaska Teacher Placement.


THE BOTTOM LINE

Anchorage's job market is rebounding modestly after a devastating 2020. Almost every industry sector is seeing moderate to significant job growth compared to October 2020; however, there are new considerations with the discovery of the new Omicron variant. Current economic and labor trends indicate that we are 4 to 7 years away from full employment recovery to pre-pandemic levels.




ANCHORAGE EMPLOYMENT

Total Anchorage employment is at 142,500 in October of 2021, showing an increase of 4,100 jobs compared to the same month in 2020.






Anchorage's goods producing sector is flat with no change in job numbers for the month of October 2021 compared with the same period in 2020.

CONSTRUCTION EMPLOYMENT

At 7,700 jobs, Anchorage construction employment is up 100 jobs, a 1.3% increase in October compared to the same period in 2020.

OIL & GAS EMPLOYMENT


Anchorage's oil and gas sector shed 300 jobs between October 2021 and October 2020. This is a 14.3% decline.



Services providing industries gained approximately 4,100 jobs between October of 2021 and October of 2020. This rebounding job growth is mainly the result of the continuing vaccination efforts to suppress the COVID-19 pandemic and a return of opportunities in the tourism sector. We understand it will take 3 to 5 years to return to pre-pandemic levels in this sector.






PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS SERVICES

Anchorage's professional & business services sector saw an increase of 300 jobs in October 2021 compared to the same month in 2020.



Health care employment is up 100 jobs in October 2021 versus October 2020. While we know hospital were operating at critical care levels earlier in the fall, we are happy to see staffing levels rebound modestly as hospitalizations and case loads have decreased in the Anchorage area.



Anchorage Single Family Home Listings Monthly Totals 10-Year Comparison as of 10/31/2021



ANCHORAGE SINGLE-FAMILY HOME LISTINGS

YTD 10-YEAR COMPARISON

Anchorage's single-family home listings stood at 379 for the month of October 2021, a decrease of 145 from 524 listings in October 2020, a -14% decline in inventory for sale from 2020.



Anchorage Single Family Home Monthly Unit Sales Monthly 10-Year Comparison as of 10/31/2021


ANCHORAGE SINGLE-FAMILY HOME MONTHLY UNIT SALES






ANCHORAGE SINGLE-FAMILY HOME AVERAGE SALES PRICE

YTD 10-YEAR COMPARISON

The average price of a single-family home in Anchorage stood at \$416,884 in October 2021, up \$9,874 from \$407,010 in October 2020. Year to date, the average price of a home sold in Anchorage in 2021 stands at \$421,784, which is up \$30,081 compared to the same period in 2020 or an increase of 11%.



ANCHORAGE SINGLE-FAMILY HOMES TOTAL UNIT SALES

YTD 10-YEAR COMPARISON

The number of single-family home unit sales year-to-date increased in October 2021 to 2,977, up by 336 units sold compared to the period in 2020, showing a significant 9% increase in home sales for the year.



UNEMPLOMENT TAKEAWAY

Anchorage's unemployment rate in October was 4.7%, down .6% compared to the previous month of September. This time last year, Anchorage had an unemployment rate of 5.3% in October of 2020. As we continue to see unemployment rates fluctuate, we want to keep in mind that changes are on the horizon with the State of Alaska moving on from federal unemployment aid. In October there were 7,006 unemployed individuals compared to 8,069 in October of 2020. Anchorage's labor force stands at 147,271 (employment + unemployment = labor force).

Anchorage continues to show the lowest unemployment numbers in the southcentral region with Kenai coming in at 6.1% unemployment, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough at 5.6% unemployment and the State of Alaska as a whole at 5.3% unemployment for the month of October 2021.


