MONTHLY SUMMARY

Job numbers for the month of November show an increase of 4,300 jobs up from November of 2020. Almost all sectors saw positive growth with the exception of oil & gas, information, and state government.

The number of single-family homes sold year-to-date has increased by 12%. The average sale price so far in 2021 has risen by 11%. Single-family home listings decreased by 63% compared to the same period in 2020, suggesting that the housing market is falling deeper into a seller's market. With national inflation at an all time high, we are interested to see what the federal government does as we move into 2022. The top five employers posting jobs are Providence Health & Services, Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium, Humana, Anchorage School District, and State of Alaska.



THE BOTTOM LINE


Anchorage's job market is rebounding modestly after a devastating 2020. Almost every industry sector is seeing moderate to significant job growth compared to November 2020; however, there are new considerations with the discovery of the new Omicron variant. Current economic and labor trends indicate that we are 4 to 7 years away from full employment recovery to pre-pandemic levels.





ANCHORAGE EMPLOYMENT

Total Anchorage employment is at 141,500 in November of 2021, showing an increase of 4,300 jobs compared to the same month in 2020.




GOODS PRODUCING JOBS

Anchorage's goods producing sector is up 200 jobs with no change in job numbers for the month of November 2021 compared with the same period in 2020.



CONSTRUCTION EMPLOYMENT

At 7,700 jobs, Anchorage construction employment is up 300 jobs, a 1.3% increase in November compared to the same period in 2020.




OIL & GAS EMPLOYMENT

Anchorage's oil and gas sector shed 300 jobs between November 2021 and November 2020. This is a 13.6% decline.





SERVICE PROVIDING JOBS

Services providing industries gained approximately 4,100 jobs between November of 2021 and November of 2020. This rebounding job growth is mainly the result of the continuing vaccination efforts to suppress the COVID-19 pandemic and a return of opportunities in the tourism sector. We understand it will take 3 to 5 years to return to pre-pandemic levels in this sector.

PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS SERVICES

Anchorage's professional & business services sector saw an increase of 300 jobs in November 2021 compared to the same month in 2020.

HEALTH CARE EMPLOYMENT

Health care employment is up 200 jobs in November 2021 versus November 2020. While we know hospital were operating at critical care levels earlier in the fall, we are happy to see staffing levels rebound modestly as hospitalizations and COVID-19 caseloads have decreased in the Anchorage area.



YTD 10-YEAR COMPARISON


Anchorage's single-family home listings stood at 291 for the month of November 2021, a decrease of 150 from 441 listings in November 2020, a -16% decline in inventory for sale from 2020.

YTD 10-YEAR COMPARISON


Anchorage's single-family home monthly unit sales stood at 304 in November 2021, which is up 12 from November 2020 at 292 sales


Anchorage Single Family Home Average Sale Price YTD 10-Year Comparison as of 11/30/2021

YTD 10-YEAR COMPARISON

The average price of a single-family home in Anchorage stood at \$418,264 in November 2021, up \$9,874 from \$400,179 in November 2020. Year to date, the average price of a home sold in Anchorage in 2021 stands at \$421,241, which is up \$28,767 compared to the same period in 2020 or an increase of 11%.

ANCHORAGE SINGLE-FAMILY HOMES TOTAL UNIT SALES

YTD 10-YEAR COMPARISON

The number of single-family home unit sales year-to-date increased in November 2021 to 3,286, up by 350 units sold compared to the period in 2020, showing a significant 11% increase in home sales for the year.



UNEMPLOMENT TAKEAWAY

Anchorage's unemployment rate in November was 4.6%, down .1% compared to the previous month of October. This time last year, Anchorage had an unemployment rate of 6% in November of 2020. As we continue to see unemployment rates fluctuate, we know that there are over 14,000 available job openings in the Anchorage area alone. There appear to be barriers for workforce and for employers alike that we seek to understand more fully. In November there were 6,992 unemployed individuals compared to 9,051 in November of 2020. Anchorage's labor force stands at 151,517 (employment + unemployment = labor force).

Anchorage continues to show the lowest unemployment numbers in the southcentral region with Kenai coming in at 6.5% unemployment, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough at 5.5% unemployment and the State of Alaska as a whole at 5.4% unemployment for the month of November 2021.


