### **MONTHLY SUMMARY**

Job numbers for the month of February show an increase of 5,200 jobs up from February of 2021, a time that was impacted by COVID-19 shutdowns. Almost all sectors saw modest to significant growth with the exception of oil & gas, health care, Information, and federal and state government.

The number of single-family homes sold year-to-date has increased by 2.9%. The average sale price so far in 2022 has risen by 10%. Single-family home listings decreased by 44% compared to the same period in 2021, suggesting that the housing market is falling deeper into a seller's market. With national inflation at an all-time high, we are interested to see what the federal government does as we progress into 2022. The top five employers posting jobs are Providence Health & Services, Humana, Anchorage School District, Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium, and the State of Alaska.

#### THE BOTTOM LINE


Anchorage's job market continues to rebound in 2022. Most industry sectors are seeing moderate to significant job growth compared to February 2021; opportunities for a solid year of growth are developing in the broader economy thanks to a bright outlook for tourism, transportation, and professional and business services. Current economic and labor trends indicate that we are 6 to 7 years away from full employment recovery to pre-pandemic levels.






## ANCHORAGE EMPLOYMENT

## **GOODS PRODUCING JOBS**


Anchorage's goods producing sector is flat with no change in job numbers for the month of February 2022 compared with the same period in 2021.


## Construction Employment Municipality of Anchorage 2016-Present



## CONSTRUCTION EMPLOYMENT

At 6,200 jobs, Anchorage construction employment is up 200 jobs, a 3.3% increase in February compared to the same period in 2021.

#### Oil & Gas Employment Municipality of Anchorage 2016-Present




## **OIL & GAS EMPLOYMENT**

Anchorage's oil and gas sector shed 400 jobs between February 2022 and February 2021. This is a 20% decline.


## **SERVICE PROVIDING JOBS**

Services providing industries gained approximately 5,200 jobs between February of 2022 and February of 2021. This rebounding job growth is mainly the result of waning COVID-19 case counts and could be negatively affected by a new variant of the virus causing a possible surge in cases in the future.



## PROFESSIONAL & BUSINESS SERVICES


Anchorage's professional & business services sector saw an increase of 300 jobs in February 2022 compared to the same month in 2021.



## **HEALTH CARE EMPLOYMENT**

Health care employment is down 200 jobs in February 2022 versus February 2021. We are happy to see hospitalizations and COVID-19 caseloads have decreased in the Anchorage area and are hopeful this sector will return to positive job growth later in the year.






#### **ANCHORAGE SINGLE-FAMILY HOME LISTINGS**

#### YTD 10-YEAR COMPARISON

Anchorage's single-family home listings stood at 157 for the month of February 2022, a decrease of 123 from 280 listings in February 2021, a -44% decline in inventory for sale from 2021.

## YTD 10-YEAR COMPARISON


Anchorage's single-family home monthly unit sales stood at 173 in February 2022, which is up 1 from February 2021 at 172 sales.

## YTD 10-Year Comparison as of 12/31/2021




## ANCHORAGE SINGLE-FAMILY HOME AVERAGE SALES PRICE

#### YTD 10-YEAR COMPARISON

The average price of a single-family home in Anchorage stood at \$415,265 in February 2022, up \$36,951 from \$378,314 in February 2021. Year to date, the average price of a home sold in Anchorage in 2022 stands at \$426,825, which is up \$38,777 compared to the same period in 2021 or an increase of 10%.

#### YTD 10-YEAR COMPARISON

The number of single-family home unit sales year-to-date increased in February 2022 to 362, up by 9 units sold compared to the period in 2021, showing a significant 2.5% increase in home sales for the year.

## **UNEMPLOMENT TAKEAWAY**

Anchorage's unemployment rate in February was 4.5%, down .3% compared to the previous month of January. This time last year, Anchorage had an unemployment rate of 7.2% in February of 2021. As we continue to see unemployment rates fluctuate, we know that there are over 21,000 available job openings posted in the Anchorage/Mat-Su area in the last two months. The outmigration of workers to the Lower-48, combined with the surge in retirements and lack of affordable and available daycare, is creating significant workforce shortages not only in Anchorage, but across Alaska. In February there were 6,838 unemployed individuals compared to 10,682 in February of 2021. Anchorage's locally based labor force stands at 153,350 (employment + unemployment = labor force).

Anchorage continues to show the lowest unemployment numbers in the Southcentral region with Kenai coming in at 7.1% unemployment, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough at 6.4% unemployment and the State of Alaska as a whole at 5.6% unemployment for the month of February 2022.
